This term, we our Understanding Christianity unit is 'Creation' We will learn about the Christian creation story, and consider why it is important to Christians, and what this story tells Christians about God.



Ways to help at home

Here are some ways you could help your child at home:

- Learn and recall the number bonds to 10 and 20 (e.g. $4+6=10$, $4+16=20$)
- Count groups of objects up to 100, recognise and write numbers to 100 and Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Using 2p, 5p and 10p coins is great for this, and supports an understanding of money.
- Look at the time on analogue and digital clocks, noticing when it is o'clock and half past the hour
- Daily reading - read to your child for a minimum of ten minutes and they read to you for ten minutes (it doesn't have to be the same book!)
- Spellings - please refer to the year 1 and 2 common exception word lists. Your child needs to be able to both read and independently spell of these words.

This term's topic - 'Woodland Wonder'



Our very first Topic will link together our Science learning about plants and habitats with our writing focus linked to the story 'Little Red Reading Hood' (no - that isn't a typo, it's a different version of the traditional tale where our main character loves reading!). In geography, we will learn about the seven continents of the World, focusing in on the extremes with the cold North and South Poles and the very hot Equator. In art, we will draw flowers inspired by the work of Georgia O'Keefe and sculpt flowers out of clay, which will be displayed in St James' Church around Remembrance time next term.



Reading books

We encourage your child to read at home with you every day, and then we ask that a parent writes a short comment, signs and dates the record book to say your child has read. Your child's RWI phonics books will be changed by their phonics teacher as soon as they have completed it in school. They need to bring their reading and record book to and from school **every day**. Thank you for your support with helping your child become a great reader!

- Practise reading and spelling the year 1 and 2 common exception word list (see below)
- Additional worksheet activities may be sent home from time to time to support consolidation of school learning.
