Dear Mrs Walker

Just one comment, can I ensure that the school will be in line with the new guidelines and very very clear that it is not possible to be 'born in the wrong body', and absolutely no encouragement of gender / sex stereotypes, as it is vitally important young people and children understand any human can behave (or dress) in any way they like and that there is no such thing as 'boy' behaviour or 'girl' behaviour which lead people to try and fit in with these stereotypes and can ultimately lead to medical issues. Obviously trans could still be discussed if necessary.

I am concerned as Ethan loves to play and dress up with 'girls' things and has before mentioned this, such as the inappropriate show 'the boy in the dress' which actually pushes an agenda rather than dismantling outdated

stereotypes.

Can I also confirm that the school is not in any way affiliated with Stonewall and will be using government approved sources and not charity produced resources? And that these will be fully looked at by teachers and not just taught without consideration? As a secondary school teacher I am familiar with the inappropriate resources which have been being used in schools over the last few years and very aware of the changes the current government have made.

So sorry this is late, I hope you'll allow me to comment still. I have read through most, but not all of the content, and it seems excellent. I'm so pleased children are being exposed to this education.

I have one very specific question, which is whether all the children learn that girls and women do not wee out of their vagina as their vulva also contains the urethra? I'm always amazed when I come across adult clients through work who don't know this!

I also wonder whether Year 6 would benefit from knowing about a scheme launched this week called Report Remove. It encourages children to report images of them which think maybe online, including self-generated images. Although it seems young, the IWF found that 11-13 year olds make up a large percentage of children who are encouraged to share inappropriate photos of themselves online as they don't have the maturity to understand.
