Use of everyday materials

Know what different materials look like and describe their properties.

Sequence events in chronological order.

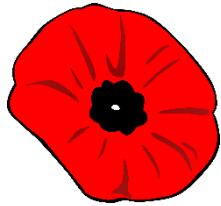
Recall key facts about the First World War and people's experiences of it.

Children will design and make their own glove puppet.

Children will research and experiment with joining and fastening textiles while taking into account how the user will interact with the puppet, the final appearance, and the level of finishing.

Children will practise joining fabrics together using a range of techniques including gluing, sewing and stapling before deciding how they will make their own puppet.

Geography

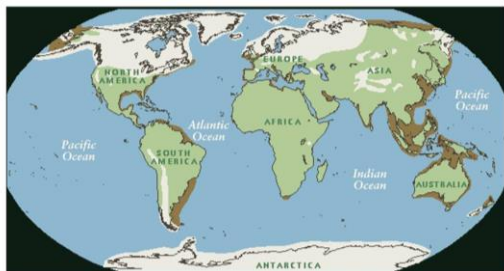
Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?

Locate and learn the names of the continents of the world.

Music Express: Weather Christmas Performance

Perform a rhythmic chant and playing an independent rhythm pattern to accompany it.

Perform an updated version of a traditional nursery rhyme with a rap section included.

Accompany a song with three different repeated word patterns.

Identify and responding to changes in pitch, upwards and downwards.

Understand and performing upwards and downwards pitch direction.

Sing songs with expression paying attention to the pitch shape of the melody.
